The Bells Ring Out.

After 2 years of planning and 9 months of hard work the bells at Hartpury, Corse and Staunton churches are all back and working.

Staunton bells have new steel beams replacing the original badly corroded ones supporting the bells and frame and all new fittings to the bells. Corse has had the badly rusted frame painted, new bearings, wheels and rollers fitted and the Ellacombe chiming mechanism repaired to working condition.

Hartpury has been subject to major works; a new floor being installed creating a new ringing room higher up the tower with an exhibition room in the old ringing room for visitors to learn about the history of bellringing. Two additional bells have been added so there is now a peal of 8 bells, the only church in our benefice to have 8 bells.

Training bells have also been installed at Staunton and Hartpury so learners can be taught to ring safely without having to use the actual church bells.

The bells at Hartpury were rung for the first time at 7pm on the 7th of November by local ringers, just in time for the dedication services at all three churches on the following day. Delivered, as they say, "just in time", although there is still a lot of work to be done to finish off the project – but the pressure is off.

On the 8th of November, The Rt. Rev'd. Rachel Treweek, Bishop of Gloucester and Rev. John Longuet-Higgins, conducted a Service of Thanksgiving, Dedication and Rededication and Celebration for the bells at each church. These were well attended by parishioners, friends and representatives of the Gloucester and Bristol Association of Church Bell Ringers.

Following the dedication there was open ringing at each church which was enjoyed by local bellringers and others who had travelled considerable distance to ring the bells.

Over the weekend of the 16th and 17th of March 2024 it is planned that peals will be rung on all three sets of bells to celebrate the completion of the project; each peal will last for about three hours.

Peals at these churches are rare, Hartpury has had 8 since 1927, the last in 1998, Staunton 7 peals since 1902, the last in 1974 and Corse 14 peals since 1907 with the last once as recently as 2022.

Later in 2024 it is planned to have an open day where people will be able to visit the Hartpury bell exhibition room and have a chance to ring on the training bells at Hartpury and Staunton – date to be advised.

The work at each church was extensively recorded and this is being compiled into video which will also be available later next year.
